Together we learn and grow



We have had a very busy start to the spring term across the school and it has been wonderful to see our vision statement echoed in each and every class. The children have also been thinking about how we help each other to learn and grow, which includes looking after our environment and our precious classroom resources so that they are ready for someone else to use when we have finished with them. Learning behaviours across the school are very good and the children are really enthusiastic about their learning which has been wonderful to see.



One of the things which is really important to us in our curriculum offer for your child is their vocabulary development. Research shows us that the number and variety of words known by a child in the early years of their schooling is a significant predictor of their success in later life, so ensuring that the children at Maple are learning and being exposed to rich vocabulary is really important to us. We hope that the weekly overviews, which you receive from your year groups, are also helping to stimulate conversation at home. Talking to you at home about what they are learning will really help your child to develop their confidence and understanding when using new vocabulary.

Jewellery at school

We would like to continue to remind families about our policy regarding the wearing of jewellery in school.

No jewellery should be worn in school (unless for very specific reasons which have been agreed by the head teacher, e.g. watches for year 2, religious or cultural reasons, medical alert jewellery).

Earrings cannot be worn in school and children are unable to take part in PE sessions if they are wearing them. Teaching staff are **not allowed** to remove or cover earrings with a plaster and you may be contacted by the school office should your child arrive at school wearing earrings. Please contact the school office to arrange an appointment to discuss this with Mrs Barwell if required.

The only exception to our general no jewellery policy is that we do allow children in year 2, under certain circumstances, to wear watches to school.

Children in year 2 may wear a **simple small watch** with an analogue clock face (rather than digital) as we recognise that this can be a supportive way to help them to develop their understanding of time.



Any watches worn are done so at their own risk and the school will not be held responsible for any broken or lost watches. The children will also be expected to remove their own watches for PE as they should not be worn during this time for health and safety reasons. Teachers will also speak to you about the suitability of your child wearing a watch if they are distracted by it – should your child not be able to wear a watch sensibly then they will be asked not to wear it to school.

Please be aware that fit bits, smart watches, digital watches, watches with cameras, video abilities etc., are not allowed under any circumstances.

Relationships and Sex Education Policy

RSE is taught within the personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education curriculum.
