
#### MAPLE FESTIVAL OF COLOUR

#### Y1 Trip to The Look Out Discovery



On Tuesday 1st March, the Year 1 children visited The Look Out Discovery Centre in Bracknell to explore the science museum and interact with the hands-on activities in the different zones for learning.

There was so much to see and do at the centre including playing with boats in the indoor stream, observing the insects in the insect enclosure, making our own paper helicopters to fly using the force of wind, investigating how heat changes our image on a thermal camera in the light room and so much more!!

The 'Build-it' zone was a very special place to explore, it was here we saw how well our children are able to work together and communicate to problem solve when fixing a house by collecting and attaching tiles to a roof and building their own walls and rooms with the bricks!

We also loved climbing the high tower to see the tree tops up close and see the local area from a 'birds eye view'. Some children commented how the houses looked like 'dolls houses' and that they 'loved the fresh air'.

# Y2 Trip to the National History Museum



On Monday 7<sup>th</sup> February, the Year 2 children visited The Natural History Museum in London to follow in the footsteps of Charles Darwin and broaden their knowledge about different species.

## NSPCC PANTS Campaign - How to help your child stay safe

PANTS is a simple and clever acronym devised by the NSPCC to teach children the underwear rule. The NSPCC PANTS rule helps parents and carers talk to their children about staying safe. By using the PANTS rule, where each letter covers a different rule and communicates a simple and valuable lesson, it can help to keep a child safe.

We understand that you do not want to scare or upset your children, and you may feel it is too soon – but PANTS has been created specifically to make sure these conversations are as easy and appropriate as possible for children between the ages of 4-11.
