REPORTS

All parents will receive a written report in the Summer Term which will highlight the progress which your child/children have made throughout the year. Should you wish to discuss your child's report with their class teacher, you will be able to arrange a meeting with them following receipt of your child's report.

Attendance

As families are aware Maple Infants' School monitors pupil attendance very carefully and any attendance which reaches 90% or lower is considered as persistent absence. We will therefore continue to write to the families of any pupil whose attendance is currently lower than 90% to inform them of this. Whilst we understand that for some pupils this attendance may be linked to sickness or authorised absence for exceptional circumstances we would like families to be fully aware of their pupils attendance and to offer to meet families to explore how we can work together to improve their child's attendance where possible.

Private Fostering – Are you looking after someone else's child?

If you are looking after someone else's child (under the age of 16, or under 18 if disabled) you may be a private foster carer. Private fostering is an arrangement between a parent and a carer. This is an arrangement between a parent and a carer. This arrangement does not involve the council and the child is not in care. A private foster carer is someone who isn't a parent or a close relative (step parents, grandparent, sister or brother, aunt or uncle.) A carer could be from extended family, a family friend or someone unknown to the child. **Please let Miss Funnell or Mrs Barwell know if you feel that you may be privately fostering a child or would**

like to discuss this further.

Information for the families of Year 2 pupils who are going to SASM in Year 3

As the pupils in Year 2 have been together in their class since Reception, St Andrews and St Marks have requested that classes are re-organised for pupils moving to them for Year 3 again this year. There are many reasons for this to take place, including support for pupils to widen both their working and also friendship groups, it enables pupils to develop their resilience, provides an opportunity to achieve a good gender balance and also to balance ability levels. As Maple staff know your children so well, we will be providing SASM with suggested classes towards the second half of the summer term. This will be completed carefully and sensitively and we will invite pupils to identify 5 friends whom they would like to be with and guarantee them being with at least 1 of their closer friends. We will inform parents when we are inviting year 2 pupils to do this. Please see your child's class teacher if you would like to discuss this further

KEY ASSESSMENT DATES – for your information

There are 3 key assessments periods for the following year groups; Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

- Reception - Early Years Foundation Stage Profile is due to be completed for all of our pupils by the end of the summer term
- Year 1 - Phonics screening check will take place for all Year 1 pupils during the week beginning Monday 12th June. Some Year 2 pupils may also be required to take part in the check again – Year 2 parents will be informed if your child will be taking part in the check again
- Year 2 - end of key stage 1 assessments will take place throughout the month of May for all Year 2 pupils

We would like to remind families that there is an INSET day on Friday 26th May so the last day for the children to attend school before the half term is Thursday 25th May. School will close at the usual time of 3.15pm on this day.
