Many thanks to all of our families who responded to our parent survey about communication (44% of our parent community responded). Your feedback has been very useful and we are reviewing any possible actions in preparation for the new academic year.

<u>Attendance</u>

At Maple Infants' School, we always strive for excellent attendance from all of our pupils as we know that children need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. Poor school attendance leaves pupils vulnerable to falling behind and children with poor attendance often achieve less in school. The Head Teacher and Education Welfare Officer regularly monitor children's attendance and pupil attendance at Maple has always been positive in the past. We have noticed however, that we are receiving a significant increase in the number of absence requests being made by families. We would therefore like to remind families of our attendance policy and have attached some updated information to this newsletter for your attention. Whilst we really understand the challenge that the recent pandemic has given to many families please be aware that only absence for **exceptional circumstances** will be authorised.
