



## Maple Infants' School

### PE and Sport Grant 2016-17

The government has provided additional funding to each school for academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015, 2015 to 2016 and 2016-17 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools; however schools have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The school has received the following PE funding:

- £8750 for 2013/14
- £8895 for 2014/15
- £8810 for 2015/16
- £8810 for 2016/17

*At Maple Infants' School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and wellbeing of the children. In addition, it is considered that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.*

We aimed to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision by:

- continuing to extend our PE provision and offering a range of PE opportunities for all pupils
- continuing to deliver inclusive high quality PE sessions
- increasing opportunities for pupils to take part in competitive sporting events
- increasing staff confidence and subject knowledge
- updating resources and equipment

Below is a table of planned spending for the 2016-17 budget.
