Please see the suggested home learning activities that can be completed at home, please choose a selection daily. Links and supporting documents are in the resources pack. We would encourage you to read at least 3 stories daily if possible to continue to develop the love of reading!

<p>Communication and Language</p>	<p>Choose a story at home. Can you answer how and why questions about the story e.g. What happened next? How would you feel if...? What could have happened instead? How do you think (character name) is feeling?</p>	<p>Share this audiobook from bbc radio. Can you listen carefully to a story with no pictures? Ask children to retell the story https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/eyfs-storytime-captain-flynn-and-the-pirate-dinosaurs/zvw6jhy</p>	<p>Sing a selection of Nursery rhymes from the recommended BBC link (in resources)</p> <p>Read a story on Oxford owl – choose a sound to spot. Can you find the sound in the story? How many times?</p>	<p>How many objects can you find at home beginning with the sounds s,a,t,p,l,n,m and d. Take one sound at a time, find and group your objects by sound. Could you think of another way to group your objects sorting by your own criterion?</p>
<p>Physical Development</p> <p>Simple playdough recipe</p> <p>You will need</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 8 tbsp plain flour • 2 tbsp table salt • 60ml warm water • food colouring (if available) • 1 tbsp vegetable oil <p>Method</p> <p>1. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix</p>	<p>How many jumps can you complete in a minute? What happens to your heart beat? Practise skipping and jumping on the spot. See how far you can jump. Can you remember what we can do to make us jump even further?</p> <p>Use the number cards provided to practise ordering numbers 0-20. Take a number away, which number is missing.</p>	<p>Using a baking tray and some fairy liquid or bubble bath. Can you use a pastry brush, paintbrush or other utensil to write some tricky words. Can you make them disappear?</p> <p>Give children a number card. What number do you have? Which number is one more? Which number is one less? How could we use objects to check?</p>	<p>Tweezers and pasta game – have two pots available, can children use tweezers, spoons or other small utensils to transfer from one pot to another? How many can you do in one minute? Two minutes?</p>	<p>Using sponges or facecloths can the children soak in bubbly water and squeeze to wring dry. Keep playing practising squeezing and releasing.</p>



<p>together the water, a few drops of food colouring and the oil.</p> <p>2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.</p> <p>3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth, pliable dough. If you want a more intense colour you can work in a few extra drops of food colouring.</p>

<p>Literacy</p>	<p>Phonics – Practise reading and writing the phase 2 and 3 tricky words</p> <p>Play matching word and card game</p>	<p>Phonics – Practise singing the tricky words song. Can you write any of the tricky words</p> <p>Can you read two of the silly questions? Can you answer them?</p>	<p>Choose a reader book from Oxford owls – Link in suggested website handout. Can you sound out and blend to read the story. Use the speaker icon to listen to the story to check you have read it correctly. Play the activity games at the end of the story.</p>	<p>Play obb and bob game on phonics play.co.uk focusing on the sounds air, ear, oi, ai,</p> <p>Play dragons den on phonics play.co.uk focusing on the sounds oo, ar, ee, igh and ng.</p>



	<p>Write a letter to your teacher to tell them what you have been doing at home – focus on correct spelling of to, dear, I, like,</p> <p>e.g. To Miss Dowd, I can jump. I have been counting etc.</p>	<p>Draw a map of your house, can you label your map with words like, stairs, wall, bed, pans, floor, light etc.</p>	<p>Read a story, can you draw a picture of a character and describe him/her using he/she? e.g. She has long hair and big sharp teeth.</p>	<p>Play phonics games on teach your monster to read. Can you help the monster to solve the problems to complete his adventure?</p>
Maths	<p>Daily days of the week (tune of Frere Jaques) Today is Today is All day long, all day long, yesterday was Tomorrow will be all day long, all day long.</p> <p>Choose 2 toys, if you have 10 pieces of dry pasta and you share it fairly how many will each toy have (halving)? Repeat with numbers within 20 and model how to share fairly.</p>	<p>Look at the ladybirds. Can you use the ladybirds to draw spots 1-6 on one side of each ladybird. If you draw the same on the other side can you find the double? (revisiting doubling up to 12)</p> <p>What 3D shapes do you have at home? Look around your house and find the 3D shapes cube, cuboid, cone, pyramid and sphere. How do you know which shape you have? Focus on using the correct mathematical language e.g. faces.</p>	<p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=dFzAU3u06Ps Sing the money song. Talk about the values of 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p. Which coins could we use to make 2p, 5p, 7p, 9p, 12p and 14p? What about 10p? Is there more than one way of making 10p?</p>	<p>Complete one of the addition activities. Can you use the fruits to help you? If you can complete all of the addition number sentences could you think of your own? Use pasta or small toys to help you solve the number sentences.</p> <p>What 2D shapes can you find at home, count the sides to identify the shapes. How can we tell which shapes we have?</p>
Understanding the World	<p>Floating and sinking investigation</p> <p>Can you find things around the house? Will they float or sink? Make predictions and then test your objects. Can you think of a way to record your findings?</p>	<p>Listen to the story of the hungry caterpillar https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY Talk about what happens during the process of changing from a caterpillar to a butterfly. Can you draw pictures of the hungry caterpillar at each stage and write a label?</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your family tree and label it together. Talk about times that are special in our lives like birthdays or religious festivals.</p> <p>Talk about how different families celebrate different things.</p>	<p>Is there something at home that you could use to explore technology. Find all of the things in your home that require technology such as remote control, toaster, microwave, ipads, radio etc. Can you find a way to record your findings?</p>
