School Voluntary Fund

At Maple Infants' School, we wholeheartedly believe that early years' education sets the scene for the children's learning journey as they begin their school life. These early years play a crucial role in igniting and inspiring learning from an early age and our mission statement 'together we learn and grow' reflects the importance of establishing that learning is a journey which continues as we grow.

It is therefore crucially important for us to be able to provide the children with rich experiences that not only broadens their understanding, knowledge and skills but also supports their own personal development and enables them to extend their own cultural capital. We strive to provide a rich programme of experiences and events that would not be possible without additional financial support.

We have a number of ways families can financially support our school and in turn enhance the experiences of their child.

At a time when all schools in England are facing significant government funding cuts we rely on any additional funding to support the provision, which we provide the pupils at Maple Infants' School. Our Governing Body has set up a School Voluntary Fund that welcomes regular donations, as well as those given on a more ad hoc basis. The money raised by this fund is used to enhance our children's education by contributing, for instance, to the improvement of recreational and teaching facilities or to provide added value to the curriculum beyond what is funded by the government.

Our requested donation is £60 per year per child or £5 per month. If half of our families made this regular donation, it would provide the school with approximately an additional £10,000.

We can receive your donation in the following ways:

You will be able to pay your voluntary contribution by logging into ParentMail and going to the 'Payments To Pay' tab, where you will see "voluntary contribution" as an option to purchase.

The Ribbon Project – Maple Infants' School

Earlier in the term, Maple Infants' School, alongside St Andrews and St Marks Junior School, Lime Tree Primary School and RHACC Hillcroft Campus, were invited to take part in The Ribbon Project. This project has been conceived by local Community Interest Company, Surbiton Art Trail and is designed to connect local schools and their community, with visitors to Surbiton.

It was also decided that the ribbon project would also serve as a tribute to Queen Elizabeth II. This artwork will form part of the art trail that will be unfolding around Surbiton in the coming months. We hope that families have been able to take time to add your ribbons, which we sent home to you, to add to the instalment.

On Friday 16th September, our Year 2 School Parliamentarians proudly attended an event at the station to launch this project and met with the Rt Hon Edward Davey MP, Lord Major of Kingston, Councillor Diane White and Deputy Lieutenant, Mr Ranson. We were incredibly proud of how the children represented Maple and really enjoyed being part of the launch.

Safety at the beginning and end of the school day

It has been brought to our attention that many families are queuing outside the school prior to our gates being opened in the morning and this has become a safety concern.

At Maple, we want our children and their families to remain safe at all times and so we will be opening our school gates slightly earlier, from **8.35am** in future, which will hopefully, alleviate any queuing on the street. Parents must ensure that their child or children are supervised at all times when entering the school site and that whoever is dropping their child off ensures that they enter their classroom before leaving school. We really hope that this supports our community.

We would also like to remind all parents and carers, that when entering the school playground at drop off or collection times, children **must not** use the school-climbing frame and equipment. We also expect the children with scooters to be walking with their scooters whilst in the playground as the playground is very busy at these times. Please also be aware that families are able to leave scooters in school during the day in the mushroom pods at their own risk. However, we are unable to accommodate any other form of transport e.g. bikes.

<u>Partnership with Parents – Communication</u>

We know that a positive partnership between home and school really contributes to any child reaching their full potential and so communication is always very important in our school setting. At Maple we therefore welcome communication from you and would always encourage a parent or carer to make contact with their child's class teacher in the first instance should anything arise that they would like to discuss.

Communication can also be directed to our phase leaders (Mrs Banks - EYFS Lead Nursery and Reception or Miss Mason KS1 Lead Year 1 and Year 2). Arranging to speak to any of these members of staff can either be done directly at the classroom doors or via the school office. Should you wish to discuss anything directly with Mrs Barwell or Miss Funnell then please do make contact with the school office who will be able to arrange this. Part of Miss Funnell's role is Maple's Inclusion Leader and should you have any specific questions or concerns relating to special educational needs, we would ask you to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with her and or Miss Allen who is our SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator).

It is also essential that we make regular contact with our families to share events and to keep you well informed but also at times as part of our local community. We would therefore like to make our communication with you clear so that you know what you will be receiving:

- *Telephone & email we reply to any emails sent to us via email. We may also call you; this is generally when we need to make quick contact with you. Any individualised contact we need to make with you will generally be via email.
- * ParentMail this form of communication is often used to share wider general communication. When we need to send information to a group/class/year group/whole school, we tend to send this via ParentMail. Wherever possible, if we receive information to pass onto parents

from others within the local community e.g. local authority, we will endeavour to title this 'Community News' and share multiple communications rather than individually wherever possible, as we have had feedback that school communication can be overwhelming.

You will also receive monthly newsletters, just like this one, which highlights events which have taken place in school, general information and towards the end of the newsletter we highlight any forthcoming dates for your diary.

We also have regular communication that the teachers share, which supports you to understand what the children are learning about in school. These are sent at the end of every week for each year group and share with you what the children will be learning about in the week ahead. We really hope that these overviews help you to understand what your child is learning in school and therefore help to aid discussions at home. We know that vocabulary is incredibly important to children's learning and that the more words known is an indicator of academic success in later life, so it is really important to us to share key learning and vocabulary with you. These overviews will also highlight what is being taught in phonics, reading and maths. Please do encourage your child to talk to you about what they are learning in school and to use the vocabulary highlighted. If you have any questions about the overviews, then please do speak to individual class teachers.

Considerate Parking

Please could you ensure that should you need to drive to school to bring or collect your child, that you **park with consideration**. Unfortunately, we have recently had several instances of parent's cars blocking driveways and entranceways to flats, homes and businesses around our school.
