Staffing

Keeping Children Safe at Maple Infants' School

The safety and welfare of all of our pupils is the greatest priority for all of the staff at Maple Infants' School and although all staff share this responsibility our Senior Leadership Team hold specific roles to lead this commitment. If you have any concerns, no matter how small they may seem, about the safety or welfare of a child, please contact our school's **Designated Safeguarding Lead, Miss Helen Funnell**. Year Group Communication

All year groups will now be receiving weekly overviews to keep families updated with your child's learning. These weekly overviews will be sent every Friday in preparation for the week ahead. We are also in the process of ensuring that the children all have access to Google Classroom where we will provide resources for you to access from home. Google Classroom will also be used to support remote education for any children needing to self-isolate.

You will also shortly receive general information from your year group teaching team. This information will provide you with all of the information which you need to know about routines, expectations and plans for the year ahead. As always, if you have any questions or queries, please do raise these with your child's class teacher, either at the end of the day at the classroom door or through email via the office.

Beginning and End of the School Day

We know that many children enjoy coming to school on scooters and bikes. Whilst we are able to keep the children's scooters in school throughout the day, we unfortunately do not have anywhere on our site to store bicycles and so we would like to request that they are not left on our school site during the school day. We are sure that you understand how precious our playground space is. In addition to this, as an infant school, we are unable to provide the children with the Bikeability Training which is offered to Junior aged children. This training follows the national standard for cycle training and assesses children on their bicycle control, general road awareness and the ability to safely manage parked cars and junctions.

Our playground gets very busy at certain times of the day especially as we are welcoming the children into school and seeing them home safely at the end of the day. With this in mind, could we please ask families to make sure that their children walk any scooters or bikes whilst they are on the school site as we have many younger members of our community within our playground at this time to look out for.

We also ask that parents ensure that children do not use the climbing frame outside of school hours as it is not supervised by staff at this time. The children are reminded of this in school.

Harvest Celebration

A highlight of this half term has always been our harvest festival where we celebrate the autumn season and all of the things that it brings. This year we will be celebrating this festival in school. Unfortunately, we are not yet in a position to invite audiences to join us in school, but we hope that your child will share with you what they have been learning about at home.

We typically think about others at this time of the year too and so we are welcoming any donations which families would like to provide for our local foodbank. Please bring any donations into school, either via classes or the school office, from Monday 18th – Wednesday 20th October and staff will ensure that your items are taken to the local foodbank. At the moment the foodbank are particularly asking for juice (squash), instant mash, rice, household items (washing up liquid, washing machine tablets), shower gel and toothbrushes. They are also asking for toilet paper. Anything non perishable can be donated, however they have got plenty of pasta, cereals, pulses, baked beans, pasta sauce and coffee at the moment.
