2021 certainly did not start as any of us expected, however everyone has quickly adapted to the latest lockdown, which feels quite different again to the previous lockdowns which we have experienced. We would like to thank all of our families for their commitment and dedication when supporting your children at home with home education. We know that for many of our families, it is not easy juggling your own work commitments, keeping households organised, alongside supporting your children, whatever their ages, with home education. We have all been incredibly impressed with the level of support and the quality of work which the children have submitted – thank you! We know that some families are sharing with us that due to different circumstances they are only able to complete some of the tasks set, please know that whatever you will be able to achieve **will** support your child. Please also remember all of the natural things that you do with your children each and every day will also be a learning experience and will present fantastic opportunities for developing vocabulary, which is so very important at this age. Sharing a bedtime story, baking some cakes, helping out in the garden, even a walk to the park can ignite rich language development. Please do feel free to contact your child's class teacher if you would like to discuss anything about home education with them.

We really hope that families are also finding the access to home education smoother since our transition to Google Classroom. We have received very positive feedback so far about this learning platform and hope that the children will be able to access their learning and receive feedback with increasing independence as they become more proficient with this system.

We have all thoroughly enjoyed seeing the children on our first Google Meet 'live' session this week. It was a wonderful way of connecting with the children. Whilst we fully support the government decision to only keep schools open to vulnerable children and those of critical workers during this latest lockdown, we are all missing our whole school community and we all wait eagerly to hear when schools may begin to open more widely. We already know that the earliest that this may begin from is the 8<sup>th</sup> March and we will of course be ready to put plans in place as soon as we receive confirmation of when and how this should happen. We will keep our families informed of any updates or plans as soon as we receive them.

As we approach the half term break, we would also like to remind everyone that it is still essential for families to report any positive COVID-19 cases to us. We continue to have a duty to support track and trace over the school break and have a system in place for parents to notify us of a positive case, and also for us to inform parents if their child needs to self-isolate as they have been in close contact with a positive case in school. Please know that we also have a similar system in place for staff.

If your child tests positive for COVID please email [covid@maple.rbksch.org](mailto:covid@maple.rbksch.org) with your child's name, class, date of when symptoms started and the date of their positive test, along with a contact phone number. This email address has been set up for the on-call senior leadership team to check daily and respond to, as required, over the school break. Should the school need to share any information with you regarding a reported positive case over the break, we will do so via Parent Mail.

Thank you again for all of your continued support and we very much hope that the next half of the spring term will bring an opportunity for us to safely begin to come together as a school community again.
